Grinding the Bevel

 Bench Grinder usually set tool rest at 27-32degrees

This is set up with a Oneway Wolverine Tool rest with the addition of a Stuart Batty rest on the left

180 Grit CbN wheel on left350 Grit CbN wheel on right

Sharpening the Edge After regrinding the edge, Joint the edge with diamond plate: ignore if edge has already been sharpened before

 Start with 1000grit diamond plate, follow with 4000Shapton or similar stone

•Finish with 12,000-16,000grit stone

 Remove burr from back by rubbing back on finest stone or use David Charlesworth ruler trick

Accessories

•Sharpening Pond – Shapton/NanoHone ~\$220, baking pan, tray from microwave- rubber mat

 Stone holder – Shapton best on the market IMO - ~\$67(Lee Valley)

Garden Sprayer to clean slurry/stone

- .Red marker to coat bevel and back
- .10X OptiVisor to examine edge

 Jig – NanoHone side sharpener ~\$190 – only side sharpener available- only if you need a jig

.Camelia oil & applicator to prevent rust

Sharpening Card Scraper
Mark thin edge with red marker

 Using a block with 90degree sides, grind this edge until all of the red marker has been removed

 Grind/hone both sides of scraper using ruler trick. Stop when the burr on each side has been removed

•Form/turn a burr on edge using a burnisher with light oil
